Through Toastmasters, many individuals have overcome this obstacle, mastered a new skill, and set themselves apart as confident leaders.




What is Toastmasters?

Toastmasters International (TI) is a non-profit educational organization that operates clubs worldwide for the purpose of helping members improve their communication, public speaking, and leadership skills.

Through its thousands of member clubs, Toastmasters International offers a program of communication and leadership projects designed to help people learn the arts of speaking, listening, and thinking.

Did you know...? Toastmasters has been around for 93 years!

Since 1924, Toastmasters international has encouraged professional and personal excellence by helping it's members develop communication and leadership skills.







The organization grew out of a single club, Smedley Chapter One Club, which would become the first Toastmasters club.

It was founded by Ralph C. Smedley on October 22, 1924, at the YMCA in Santa Ana, California, United States. Toastmasters International was incorporated under California law on December 19, 1932.



How Toastmasters Works

At Toastmasters, members learn by speaking to groups and working with others in a supportive environment. A typical Toastmasters club is made up of 10 to 20 people who meet once a week for approximately an hour. Each meeting gives everyone an opportunity to practice:

- Conducting meetings. Members learn how to plan and conduct meetings.
- **Giving impromptu speeches.** Members present one-to-two minute, impromptu speeches on assigned topics.
- Presenting prepared speeches. Members present speeches based on projects from manuals in Toastmasters' proven communication and/or leadership programs. Projects cover topics such as speaking, organization, vocal variety, language, gestures and persuasion.
- Offering constructive evaluation. Every prepared speaker is assigned an evaluator who identifies speech strengths and offers suggestions for improvement.

 techniques.





Toastmasters and Leadership


- Leadership cannot be learned in a day. It takes practice.







Distinguished Toastmaster

Toastmasters awards its highest level, Distinguished Toastmaster (DTM), to members who have achieved both the Advanced Communication Gold and Advanced Leader Silver awards.

To achieve the DTM typically takes five to eight years of dedicated service and leadership in at the local club and area (or higher) levels.

DTM candidates must also perform more than 40 public presentations.

The Distinguished Toastmaster title is not necessarily the end of the journey for most Toastmasters.



The Accredited Speaker Program



This program recognizes those Toastmasters members who have achieved a level of proficiency that enables them to be paid, professional speakers.

Being an Accredited Speaker gives you a competitive edge and sets you apart from other professional speakers because your talent and ability have been recognized by Toastmasters International, a world leader in communication and leadership development.

Unlike other professional certifications, you can't simply complete a list of tasks to become a Toastmasters Accredited Speaker; instead, you must demonstrate your speaking abilities before a live audience. Program candidates progress through two levels of evaluation and are judged by a panel of professional speakers.



Dear Mr. Rex:

I am writing to convey the U.S. Office of Personnel Management's (OPM) continuing recognition of Toastmaster International's contributions and history of service to Federal employees. OPM itself has its own Toastmasters Club which holds periodic on-site meetings. Our Club has helped to promote an organizational culture of continuous learning and an environment for professional growth for all employees.

OPM supports on-site clubs and organizations that promote the professional development of Federal employees, including Toostmasters International under the following guidelines:

- 1. Managers have the discretion to pay for the charter for and for an organization's membership fee as a condition for obtaining the training an employee needs to improve his/her performance. After the employee masters the skills promoted by the organization. (public speaking and leadership in the case of Toastmasters), the membership for must become the employee's personal responsibility.
- 2. Managers have the discretion to allow an employee to attend meetings during working hours, even if the employee bears the cost of membership, so long as the manager concludes that attendance serves the interests of the Government in employee
